



NEW HOSPITAL DEVELOPMENT IN BEXHILL: LATEST NEWS



Development Overview - CGI by Gilling Dodd Architects

Work on the planned 54-bed mental health hospital in Mount View Street is making good progress. Since our last update, we have stripped about four thousand cubic meters of topsoil from the site (the equivalent of almost two Olympic-size swimming pools). About half of this will be reused in the final landscaping once the building is complete.

We have installed temporary drainage alongside the water course and an attenuation tank basin at the lowest point on site. This means that muddy storm water is contained and only released once the suspended silt has settled sufficiently.

Other work underway includes levelling the ground which marks out the main building footprint - as well as the site offices and on-site parking compound. The main welfare cabins are due by the end of the month.

Two temporary bridges to enable heavy machinery to cross safely over the water main, which runs through the site, will also be installed later this month.
